The year 2002 was fantastic for Pam Specht of Fenton, MI and her stallion Supremacy's High Time (CH Albelarm Supremacy x Best Odds). High Time's list of winners is long, many grand mares are back in foal to him for 2003, including three embryo transfers, and horsemen are raving about his prospects.

Leading the long list of 2002 winners are RWC KY Weanling Open Futurity and top ribbon winner at the Bluegrass Futurity, High Time's High Priority (Supremacy's High Time x Callaway's High Stepper) sold for owner Patricia Misko to Undulada Farm; and Reserve Champion 2002 Bluegrass Futurity Weanling High Time's Royal Gift (Supremacy's High Time x Harlem's Royal Gift), owned by Beth Hennessey.

Others include RWC Show Pleasure Driving, High Time's Spartan, owned by Wes and Sena Boling; RWC 2-Year-Old Fine Harness Mare, Blues Clues, full brother to the 2001 MI Futurity winner High Time's Encore; the most talked-about 2-year-old 5-gaited horse at Louisville, Miramax, owned & shown by Michele Macfarlane, Jr. 3-Gaited Mare Champion at Syracuse, third at Shelbyville, and MI Futurity winner, Rosewood's Potpourri; and High Time's Princess Jewel, 4th, WI Futurity.

Pam bought Supremacy's High Time when he was only six days old. "An old friend who had seen him called and said that I 'had' to have him," Pam says. "I knew when I first saw him he was quality, extra special. I had had no dream of owning a stallion – they are

so much trouble. I bought him as a show horse. He has earned the right to be a stud because he is out-producing himself. He's a once-in-a-lifetime horse and it has sure worked out for me.

"When I pick mares for High Time I look at pedigrees first. I want good-bred mares, mares with families filled with strong-moving horses.

"Nothing is guaranteed, of course," Pam says, "but High Time pulls the good stuff from the mare's side and adds a lot of quality and movement. His foals are high headed, have nice-shaped necks and lots of size."
